2023 LYNDA (POSIVAK) MOHLENHOFF MEMORIAL AWARD 2023 MARGARET SABOL SCHOLARSHIP AWARD

Laney Schulz, a member of Wilkes-Barre Branch 6, was recently named the recipient of both the 2023 Lynda (Posivak) Mohlenhoff Memorial Award and the 2023 Margaret Sabol Scholarship Award. She is a sophomore studying biomedical engineering at The Catholic University of America, located in Washington, D.C.

During her freshman year there, Laney definitely stood out for all of her achievements and campus involvement. Some of these include participation in the STEMforHer mentorship program, membership in the Biomedical Engineering Society, membership in the of Society of Women Engineers, volunteering with the Campus Ministry to serve the homeless, vice-president of the cheerleading squad, and campus ambassador for the Office of Undergraduate Admissions, where she gives tours to prospective students and will be an orientation advisor for incoming freshmen. Additionally, she was invited into Phi Eta Sigma, a national honor

society for high achieving college freshmen. As impressive as all the above is, Laney also maintained a 3.935 grade point average and was named to the Dean's List both semesters of her freshman year.

The Lynda (Posivak) Mohlenhoff Memorial Award is given to a full-time student pursuing a degree in or relating to the field of math, science, or technology. 

- This summer marked the 100th anniversary of "Slovak Day" at Kennywood amusement park near
 Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania.
- **Slovak Heritage Tours** in Deerfield, Massachusetts, has seen an increase in Polish Americans interested in visiting Slovakia because the language and culture are so similar to their Polish heritage.
- Bishop Larry Kulick of Greensburg, Pennsylvania, visited Slovakia in July and celebrated Mass in honor of his ancestors in the towns of Nova Bystrica and Stara Bystrica.
- Actor **Ema Horvath**, 29, was born and raised in the United States by her parents who were Slovak immigrants. Since 2022, she has played Earlen in the Amazon Prime fantasy television series, "The Lord of the Rings: The Rings of Power."
- Catholic actor **Jim Caviezel** who had the starring role in the movies *The Passion of the Christ* and, more recently, *The Sound of Freedom* – has Slovak blood through his paternal grandmother.
- The United States Embassy in Slovakia created a traveling exhibit of 30 Notable Slovak Americans that was displayed first in Bratislava in April 2023 and then traveled to other cities in Slovakia. Some of figures included U.S. Air Force Colonel Eva Strelka Jenkins, a native of Bratislava, who commands thousands of troops in the U.S. military, and Steve Ditko, a comic book artist who helped to create the character of Spiderman.

JET Plan \$1.00 First Year Premium Extended for 2024

The LPSCU Board of Directors announces that the \$1.00 first year annual premium on the Juvenile Estate Term (Term-to-25) plan of insurance has been extended for the year 2024. **This offer is limited to certificates with an issue date in the year 2024.** After the first year, premiums will be billed at the rate of \$16.00 for \$10,000 of term life insurance and \$9.50 for \$5,000 of term life insurance.

The LPSCU's Juvenile Estate Term (JET) Plan, commonly referred to as Term-to-25, is an ideal insurance solution for students and is available to anyone less than 22 years of age. The plan provides full life insurance protection from date of issue to age 25. A medical exam is not required to apply. However, the LPSCU reserves the right to require a medical exam on any applicant should it be deemed necessary.

Once the JET insurance certificate is issued, coverage remains in full force and effect through the maturity date of the certificate, provided premium payments are current. This plan matures when the insured's certificate reaches the anniversary of issue date closest to his or her 25th birthday. When the certificate expires, the insured will be given an option to convert his/her current coverage amount to a legal reserve plan (permanent insurance) with no evidence of insurability being required. This is a guaranteed provision within the JET contract.

In the event of the death of the insured prior to reaching 25 years of age, the face amount of the policy is paid to the named beneficiary/ies.

The new legal reserve certificate may provide a death benefit equal to or less than the face amount of the expired JET policy. The policy date of issue will be the expiry date of the JET policy. The policy premium on the new certificate will be based on the member's age on the date of exchange and on the Society's premium rates then in effect. The first premium on the new certificate must be paid prior to the expiry date of the JET policy. Written request for exchange will be required.

JET Term-to-25 is an excellent, affordable plan providing protection for children from infancy on through their school years, including college. Now the JET Term-to-25 is even more affordable with the first year's premium costing just \$1.00. This offer is good for certificates with an issue date in the year 2024.

Focusing on National Awareness Month

National Diabetes Awareness Month

November is designated as National Diabetes Awareness Month. The American Diabetes Association hopes the focus of the month will raise awareness of diabetes symptoms, promote healthy living, and advise people of the risk factors. Did you know that one in every ten Americans has diabetes?

The most common types of diabetes are:

- ➤ Type 2 A chronic condition that affects the way the body processes blood sugar.
- ➤ Type 1 A chronic condition where the pancreas produces little or no insulin.
- Prediabetes A condition in which blood sugar is high, but not high enough to be considered Type 2.
- Gestational High blood sugar affecting pregnant women.

Symptoms of diabetes include excessive thirst, excessive hunger, extreme tiredness, very dry skin, losing weight without trying, and frequent urination, to name a few. Type 2 symptoms usually develop slowly, over time, and it can be years before you are aware of it. On the other hand, Type 1 symptoms often appear very quickly, especially in children.

Diabetes is usually treated using a combination of diet, exercise, medication and/or insulin therapy. Regular monitoring of blood sugar levels is important as well. Some people need to check their blood sugar twice per day, while for others once per day is sufficient.

You can't "fix" diabetes on your own. Trained medical professionals can guide you through treatment options. Please see a doctor for questions and treatments.

- ➤ Behavioral Irritability, social isolation

SAD can also bring about a lack of concentration and weight gain. There is help and treatment that can help. Treatment options may include light therapy, psychotherapy, and/or medications.

I'm sure most of us have been or know someone who has been "down in the dumps" because there's been x number of days without the sun. Lack of sunshine can definitely contribute to someone suffering from SAD. Reports say that going outside for as little as 20 minutes, even on gray, cloudy days, proves more beneficial to our overall well-being than staying indoors 24/7.

Be aware of your own body and don't be afraid to explore options for help if you need it.

The purpose of these monthly awareness articles is to bring to the forefront issues that people deal with every day but probably don't think about on a daily basis. The better informed we are, the better we can react to situations when needed.

- 1 bar Cracker Barrel Cheese (sharp or extra sharp)
- 2 cups milk
- 2 Tbsp. flour
- 4 Tbsp. margarine or butter
- 1 tsp. salt
- Bread crumbs
- 2 cups macaroni
 - (cooked to package directions)

Cut up cheese into small cubes. In a saucepan, melt

margarine (or butter), stir in flour, add salt and milk. Bring to a boil. Turn heat down to low and SLOWLY add pieces of cheese until all but a few are left. Pour mixture into a baking dish over cooked macaroni. Sprinkle bread crumbs, pieces of cheese, and dabs of margarine (or butter) on top. Bake at 350 degrees for 25 minutes.

LPSCU Matching Fund Program

On January 1, 2011, the LPSCU initiated a Matching Fund Program for our Branches and Districts. In the program's initial year, we had one Matching Fund project. We are pleased to report that the program has grown steadily ever since.

As a fraternal benefit society, the LPSCU encourages our Branches and Districts to participate in Matching Fund projects for the benefit of charitable organizations. The funds that are raised from a Matching Fund event will be matched dollar for dollar by the LPSCU, up to a maximum of \$100 for a Branch event and \$200 for a District event.

If a Branch or District prefers to make a non-monetary donation to a charitable organization, that can also be considered as a Matching Fund project but in that case, the matching donation will be limited to 50% of the maximum amount: \$50 for a Branch and \$100 for a District.

Each Branch and District is allowed to hold four Matching Fund events per year.

2023 SS.C.M. Appeal Nearing Conclusion

The Saints Cyril and Methodius Appeal is in its 45th year raising money to assist the Pontifical Slovak College of Saints Cyril and Methodius in Rome with its day-to-day operations. The Appeal relies upon the generosity of individual donors in addition to collections taken up in individual parishes of Slovak ancestry. A direct mailing asking for donations was sent in January to local District and Branch leaders from the four Catholic Slovak fraternal organizations, members of the Slovak Catholic Federation, clergy with Slovak ancestry, and previous donors.

As of September 15, the 2023 Appeal has received \$23,113.51 from 187 donors. Among the 57 donations received from the Slovak Catholic fraternal Branches and Districts, Branch 6, Branch 19, Branch 90, Branch 213, the Rev. Dianiska District, and the Home Office of the LPSCU have donated a total of \$650. Donations to date have been also received from six parishes, 27 clergy and religious, and 97 individuals. Arcadia Publishing

You may be familiar with one or another of the interesting, compact, paperback books of the "Images of America" series of Arcadia Publishing which operates out of Charleston, South Carolina; Chicago, Illinois; Portsmouth, New Hampshire; and San Francisco, California. This series allows you to learn the history of your hometown written by local authors. You can often find these books in your local drugstore. However, if you go on the website https://www.arcadiapublishing.com/ collections/images-of-america you will be surprised to find a number of books related to Slovak Americans in different locations of the United States. (Search "Slovak.") Some of these volumes are written by local Slovak fraternalists like John T. Sabol (Cleveland, Ohio) and Loretta Ekoniak (Youngstown, Ohio). Each book contains about 127 pages of mostly historical photographs with informative captions. As such, they are very effective in bringing memories to the surface that have been forgotten with the passage of time.

The website lists a number of Slovak-related volumes, each selling for \$21.99. I came across the following:

- Slovaks of Chicagoland by Robert Fasiang and Robert Magruder
- Slovaks of the Greater Mahoning Valley by Loretta Ekoniak (Loretta is willing to offer a small discount if you order through her – <u>Loretta.ekoniak@gmail.com</u>.)
- Slovak Pittsburgh by Lisa Alto
- A Race to Freedom the Mira Slovak Story by David Williams (This is about a young airline pilot, born in Cifer, Slovakia, who escaped communism in 1953 by hijacking his own commercial flight. He later became a hydroplane racing champion and a stunt flyer and who died in 2014.)
- The Anthracite Coal Region's Slavic Community by Brian Ardan
- Cleveland Slovaks by John T. Sabol and Lisa Alzo
- Cleveland's Buckeye Neighborhood by John T. Sabol

Also, if you search under "Catholic" you will find volumes about the historic Catholic churches in cities like Cleveland, Pittsburgh, Chicago, and Detroit, as well as histories of some religious orders like the Chardon and Covington Provinces of the Sisters of Notre Dame.

All Saints Day ~ November 1

All Saints Day in Slovakia, as well as many other Slavic countries, is a highly celebrated holy day. Slovak families travel across the country to visit cemeteries where their deceased family members are located. Cemeteries overflow with flowers and thousands and thousands of candles are lit and placed on the graves. Families take time to meet together and take care of their family members' gravesites. War memorials that commemorate the World Wars are also highly decorated. Although the practice is similar to Memorial Day in the United States, All Saints Day in Slovakia has a much larger observance. It generates more traffic on the road than virtually any other day in Slovakia, including Easter and Christmas. A large industry has sprung up to accommodate All Saints Day observance. Flower shops in town start stocking memorials several weeks before All Saints. Local radio stations play sad music all day and take calls from people to give memorials about deceased relatives. In the cemetery, the smell of burning wax is overpowering and the cemeteries are quite beautiful, especially at night.

Štedry Večer ~ Christmas Eve

Families began preparing for Christmas weeks in advance. They cleaned their homes, baked cakes, and made decorations for their trees. During the last week before Christmas, women had to return things they borrowed, wash and clean everything, and organize their work. Spinning, weaving, and cleaning were forbidden between Christmas and Epiphany.

Beginning in the early morning on Christmas Eve, preparations for the Birth of Christ are underway in every home, from the richest to the poorest. A final batch of cookies is baked and the dishes for the Christmas Eve meal are prepared. In some areas, people visit on Christmas Eve. The first visitor to the home should be a man or boy, bringing greetings of luck, health, and happiness in the coming year. If the first visitor is a woman, there is a prediction of bad luck during the entire New Year.





The holiday table is prepared with clean straw under the tablecloth or on the floor to remind us that Christ was bedded on straw in the manger. In some villages, the table legs are also bound with chains to represent the link from Christ's birth to His death. When the holiday table is prepared, one extra place is set for an unknown guest. With preparations complete, the family eagerly awaits the appearance of the first evening star.

Before dinner begins, the father or mother takes a little honey to make a small sign of the cross on the foreheads of each person. This serves as a reminder that is proper at all times to keep our Divine Redeemer in our thoughts and to live and work so that harmony and pleasant fellowship will sweeten our lives.

After a dinner of mushroom soup, bobalky (tiny biscuits steamed and served with sauerkraut or poppyseed), peas, and fish, the home is cozy and quiet.

The Legend of Christmas Angels



There once were two angel friends: one wore pink robes and the other wore blue robes. These angels were known for singing lovely duets and praised the glory of God. They also played trumpets made from pure silver that were believed to be the most melodious sounds ever heard by man. One day, 'Temira,' their orchestra leader, shared wonderful news to the members of the angelic orchestra. He said that God decided to send his 'Son' to live among 'His' people. On hearing this news, the angels were overjoyed. The



cherubs decided to prepare a musical event for the most important occasion in history. The musical event was expected to be flawless and only angels with the best voices were chosen to sing. 
